Coinshooters Board meeting January 9th

Topics:

Mini Hunt— May 19th has been picked for the mini hunt. Chris Debeer is the coordinator planning the activity. The location will be at Mariners Point (across the bay from where we normally have it). Start time will be 7am for setup. At 730 signup will begin. 8 am is the scheduled start of the hunt and 10 am is the end of the hunt. Awards and prizes will be after 10 am. Please note....these times are not set in stone. Chris is still working through all of the logistics (sponsors, prizes, sign-up, set-up and break-down and clean-up still need coordinators.). The entry price is tentatively set at \$20 for everyone.. More to come later.

Membership— The membership dues will stay at \$20 for single and \$30 for family. Right now, prorated dues are up to March. The board voted to extend the prorating until October. What this means, \$1.65 per month for single is deducted from the \$20 dues amount and \$2.50 is deducted from the \$30 dues for family. Payment is check or cash. Electronic payment are being looked into by Dave Lyon, Jeff Gardner, and Chris DeBeer. **This will be a By-Law change for the prorating.**

Competition Table Prizes-

Best find in a category prize will be a Silver Quarter instead of a Dime. Change to standing rules.

The BFOTM prize will stay at a Silver Quarter.

Find Location restriction—A motion to restrict where you find your target to the Continental United Stated and only on public land was not voted in. You can find your target wherever you want. Any find to be in competition must be found between Club meetings.

The following red sentence will be removed from the this paragraph in the bylaws with the Club approval by vote. The blue sentence will be added by Club vote. This is because sometimes you find an item that someone lost and you returned it. Or you found an item that had to be held onto by foreign authorities for a couple of month for cultural evaluation. *This is a BY-Law change and will need to be voted on by memebership.*

Monthly Find Competition Rules Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 8 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be there. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

Also, the Foreign Coin / Token category will be split into two categories with the Club <u>vote to</u> <u>change it in the By-Laws.</u>

General Standing Rules Stuff:

Gold Coin Raffle— The Board voted to start up the Gold Coin Raffle again. The Gold coin raffle tickets will be sold through out the year and the draw will be held at the Club Christmas Dinner.. First coin to be a \$2.5 U.S. Coin worth \$400 to \$500.

The question about having a Club Hunt on a different day than Sunday was discussed. It was decided to keep it on Sundays It was tried in the past and didn't work out. We will keep the Hunts on Sunday.

Door Prize Coordinator position is open and needs a volunteer.

Update: Rocky Chouinard volunteered to be the door prize coordinator as of January meeting.

General Standing Rule stuff: Blue is a change or clarification.

Coinshooters general standing rules:

What is a Sanctioned Hunt? A sanctioned hunt is an approved Hunt that has 5 or more members participating. The hunt was approved by the Club board members at the Club Board Meeting. The following paragraph is from the June 23, 2022 board meeting:

The question about changing the type of a sanctioned hunt (i.e. Mini-hunt to a wild hunt) because of circumstance (rainy weather, or some other out-of-our-control issue) was brought up and the board voted to allow a change if due notice is given prior to the hunt (email stating that a change may take place because ENTER REASON HERE.).

The Treasure Hunter of the year is the person with the most competition category wins from Jan thru November and receives the DOTY trophy.

Best Over-all find of the year. Each month a best over-all find of the month is voted on. Those winning are voted 1st,2nd, and 3rd for the year in November.

Mini Hunt - No criteria on hand

Scavenger Hunt – One spin of the 1 to 10 spinner per find on the list. Winner is who has highest score.

Awards and Prizes – recommendations

Best Find for the Monthly Hunt - Silver Quarter

Monthly Find Competition Rules Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 8 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be there. You may enter only one item in each category. items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! . Categories:

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword

<u>VOTING.</u> Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 8 preceding categories.**


