Research. We all need to do it if we want to find a relatively fresh place to detect for old coins and relics. Most of our old parks and schools have been hammered for years. That's makes it pretty tough to squeak out a good find. So, where to get some good info? Old maps are a good start. Find one old enough for the area you wish to detect and look for public places that are still available on the new maps. Looking at Google Earth can give you a bird's eye view of what it looks like now. Compare that with the old map to find spots that haven't been re-landscaped, repurposed, or completely redeveloped. The local historical society is another good source for info. Some have real nice web sites with photos to help zero in on a promising site. Old newspaper accounts can also give you clues to a possible good location. You can look at stories ranging from unsolved robberies where the money wasn't recovered, to social gatherings where coins and jewelry can get lost, to historic properties that have been redeveloped for public use. There are also books that have been written about the history of certain areas. Some, like diaries or limited editions, can be very rare and may hold critical details that aren't mentioned anywhere else. You can also just drive around an area that has some history to it and look for promising spots. Door knocking to get permission to hunt private property isn't an easy thing to do for most of us, but, those properties can be untouched and a bonanza of good finds for those with the gumption to do it. Online searches can uncover all sorts of great possibilities, so, click away!














Club Meeting at Tierrasanta Library February 27th

There were 2 changes to the Club By-Laws that were voted on by the members at the February Meeting. The first change was to split the Foreign Coin/Token category into two separate competition categories. That change passed. We now have 9 categories for the Competition table.

The Second By-Law change was in the "Monthly Find Competition Rules General info" and it was to remove the red sentence and add the blue sentence. The vote to remove the red sentence did not pass. It will stay in the General info paragraph. At the same time, the blue sentence will be added. The reason for the blue sentence is to let members submit to competition any item they found on a wild hunt or in a foreign country that was returned to the owner or withheld by the foreign country before the monthly meeting.



Monthly Find Competition Rules For Entering Your Find

General info: We currently have 9 categories. Your find should fit into one of them! Every find must have been made with a metal detector since the last meeting. (Note: If your find is sent to you from another country [i.e. England] you may enter it in the month you received it) You may enter only one item in each category. A picture of the item will be accepted if the item is not available to be at the meeting. Items that are found together count as one item. (A cross on a chain, matching bracelets, are examples.) The competition table judges will help you place your find if needed. Their decisions are final! .

Most Unusual. Our catchall category! If your item fits better elsewhere it should be placed there. Tell us what you know about your find. Age, type of metal, what makes it unusual! Examples: a brass boat rudder, a meteorite, a toy, who knows!

Relic. Must be at least 50 years old! Describe the item.

Best Foreign Coin . What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal? An undated gold Roman coin can go here!

Best Token. What is it? Is it dated? Does it have value? Type of metal?

Oldest Dated Coin. The date must be visible with a loop. We have to be able to read the date!

Best North American Coin. Canada, USA, and Mexican coins. An identifiable "slick" large cent might win this category.

Best Other Jewelry. Non-precious metal items that were made as personal adornment items or for display purposes.

Silver. Items stamped .800 and above or sterling. You can also have an item tested and certified. <u>Silver plated</u> items belong in Other Jewelry.

Gold, Platinum and Palladium. Items stamped with a claim as to the metal content, or tested and certified. Counterfeit items will be removed by the judges. <u>Gold plated non-precious metal</u> items belong in the Other Jewelry category.

Best overall. What was your favorite item from all of the other categories? It may be the most valuable find, or it may not! Examples: The gold ring with diamonds, the Civil War sword....

<u>VOTING.</u> Vote for one item in each category by circling the letter on the voting slip that corresponds with that item's envelope. **Vote once for your personal choice as to the best overall find from among the 9 preceding categories.**
